Following a career in the fashion industry Swale was employed at the School of Design, Otago Polytechnic where he continues to teach on the fashion program. He continued his studies at the University of Otago graduating with a Post Graduate Diploma in Arts in 2013. In 2020 Simon completed a Master of Fine Arts at the Dunedin School of Art in contemporary jewellery, further developing his interests in the body, adornment and identity politics. This work focused on globalisation, and the production, distribution and consumption of consumer goods around the world. Pieces from this body of work were selected for the International Graduate Show at Galerie Marzee where he won a Marzee prize. He also won the jewellery section at the ECC New Zealand Craft Design Awards that same year in 2020.

From 2020-2022 Swale was a participant of the Handshake6 mentorship program, mentored by the Berlin based artist Gabi Schillig. During this time, Swale continued to develop philosophically and politically engaged work with a strong conceptual and research focus, producing work across a range of materials and mediums, including video, performance, and photography. Swale has exhibited widely both nationally and internationally, and including his work within fashion, has produced numerous presentations and publications. Swale's work has featured in Autor magazine and in 2022 Art Jewelry Forum published his article 'Critical Walking as Post-Studio Methodology.'

In 2022 Swale was selected for a further one year mentorship; Handshake7, which will culminate with an exhibition at Galerie Marzee, The Netherlands.
